Admission and Retention of Adult Day Services

- Currently in the Iowa Administrative Code, there is a section that deals with the criteria for admission and retention of participants in adult day services. The administrative code does not allow a program to knowingly admit or retain a participant who:
 1. Is bed bound or
 2. Requires more than part time or intermittent health related care or
 3. Has unmanageable incontinence on a routine basis despite an individualized toileting program or
 4. Is medically unstable or
 5. Requires maximal assistance with activities of daily living or
 6. Is under 18 years old or
 7. Requires routine three person assistance with standing, transfer, or evacuation or
 8. Poses a danger to themselves, other participants, or the staff. "Pose a danger" may include, but is not limited to, the following situations: The person chronically elopes, the person is sexually or physically aggressive, the person's verbal abuse is unmanageable by staff, the person is in the acute stage of alcoholism, drug addiction, or mental illness
- The bill removes criteria number 1 through number 5 above. The effect of doing so is that more people will be able to participate in adult day services programs.
- Therefore, people that are bed bound, require more than part time health related care, have unmanageable incontinence, are medically unstable, or require maximal assistance with activities of daily living will be able to participate in adult day services.
- The bill codifies criteria number 6 through 8. This means that people under 18 years old; people who require routine three person assistance with standing, transfer, or evacuation; and people who pose a danger to themselves, other participants, or the staff will not be able to participate in adult day services.
- There is no fiscal impact of this bill.

Section by Section Analysis

Section 1 – Admission and Retention of Participants

Adult day services programs cannot knowingly admit or retain people that meet any of the following criteria:

1. Is under 18 years old
 2. Requires routine three person assistance with standing, transfer, or evacuation
 3. Poses a danger to themselves, other participants, or the staff. "Pose a danger" may include, but is not limited to, the following situations:
 - a) The person chronically elopes
 - b) The person is sexually or physically aggressive
 - c) The person's verbal abuse is unmanageable by staff
 - d) The person is in the acute stage of alcoholism, drug addiction, or mental illness
